DOLWD is working on Draft legislation to increase funding for the State Training and Employment Program (STEP) for individual grants and competitive training grants
HB61: proposal to allow for flexible work schedules to offer a 3/12 schedule. Also includes provisions around child labor: proposal to do away with work permits for 16yo workers and provide a blanket approval for employers employing 14yo and 15yo.

FY26 budget looks to increase AVTEC's industrial electricity program and plumbing
 HB76 and SB82 both target additional funding for secondary education in the base student allocation (BSA) towards career and technical training

- Working on a regulatory package to improve the Certificate of Fitness (COF) process. One would allow Alaska to accept licensures from additional states. Also proposing to



provisionally accept licensures from all states while they go through the COF process in Alaska.

Members and staff discussed filling vacant board seats and restructuring the statutes that established AWIB.

9:10 Final Regional Needs Assessment Report......McKinley Research Group, LLC Windy Kannenberg, Vice President, and Katie Berry, President, of McKinley Research Group, reviewed the findings of the Alaska Workforce Career Needs Assessment report. The focus of the report was identifying opportunities for statewide outreach, relationship building, aligned stakeholder engagement through listening sessions across all six economic regions, and an Alaskan employer survey. Businesses reported challenging operating, socioeconomic environments as well as capacity and financial constraints resulting in limited resources. Current trends show less workers are traveling to Alaska. 2/3 of employers surveyed across all regions indicated having difficulty hiring. Employers are contending with broad barriers to housing, childcare, public education, public transportation, a changing workforce, and salaries and benefits in both urban and rural communities. It was discussed statewide that a strong public school system is a critical workforce development pipeline.

The recommended next steps from the Final Regional Needs Assessment Report include clearly defining AWIB's role within Alaska's workforce development and how that role impacts employers, students, and workers, prioritizing key relationships, and creating a communication strategy.

• Alaska Adult Education Grant Applications Approval

One-Stop Operator Certifications are needed this spring for the Kodiak Job Center, Sitka Job Center, and Bethel Job Center. Every three years, AWIB must certify that the One-Stop Job Centers in the state meet the criteria of a comprehensive job center or an affiliated job center.
